

As you think about the baptism of your child, questions arise.

**What does faith mean to me/my spouse?*

**How do I/we live my/our faith?*

**Is the Church an authentic expression of my/our own life?*

**What is the faith I/we want our child to have?*

Responsible Baptism requires a careful consideration of such questions. In having a child baptized, parents are making a commitment of faith. Parents are committing themselves to regular and active participation in the life of the Church so that the transmission of faith to their child will become a reality.

We hope that the Baptism Preparation session will give you some assistance in answering these questions.



Choosing Godparents For Your Child

Prayerful thought should be given about the choice of Godparents for your child. This is not just an honor bestowed on a good friend or a close family member. Godparents assist parents in bringing the child into the life of the church. Because of this, Godparents should regularly worship and participate in the life of the Church. At least one must be a Roman Catholic who has received the Sacrament of Confirmation. One Godparent may be a member of another Christian faith who regularly worships and participates in the Church. If there are two Godparents, one must be male and one female. They should be at least sixteen years of age.

In accepting the responsibility of being a Godparent, the person is saying he/she wishes to become involved in the faith life of that child. The Godparent should be someone who will continually develop a relationship with the child to counsel, give assistance, and share faith as he/she grows to maturity. We ask that you share these expectations with the Godparents you choose.
